

Farahbee Rahman, Teaching Fellow in Faculty of Design

Farahbee Rahman from Bangladesh is currently an Associate Architect at DWm4 Architects in Dhaka. She is also working independently as a designer. She graduated from Department of Architecture at BRAC University in Dhaka, Bangladesh in 2013. Her thesis project was on the topic of “Branding through Icons” – Designing International Trade Fair Complex at Purbachal, Dhaka. During the fourth year of her Bachelors study she has been an exchange student at Faculty of Architecture, University of Évora for a semester of six months under Erasmus Mundus Scholarship, EMMA West exchange study program from 2011-2012. She attended the Winter School Program at CEPT University in November, 2013 during the end of her graduation. She did the course titled “Spaceship Design Principles for Micro Architecture in Extreme Cities” under the mentorship of Dr. Susmita Mohanty, CEO and co-founder of Earth2Orbit. She worked as a freelancer after her graduation for almost a year doing different tasks on Architecture and Graphics Design. In February 2014, she attended the Pittwater Summer School 2014, an Architecture Master Class organized by Architecture Foundation Australia – a weeklong residential studio at Pittwater, North Sydney under the mentorship of Architect Richard Leplastrier, Architect Peter Stutchbury and Architect Lindsay Johnston. I worked on a project in a team of four to design a “place of memory” – redesigning an abandoned house at Towlers Bay, Pittwater. She has been working with DWm4 Architects since 2015. She is looking forward to be at CEPT University as Teaching and Research Fellow.
