Students enrolled in Masters in Urban Planning are envisioning to make a Development Plan for the cities of Surat, Rajkot and Bharuch-Ankleshwar. Masters in Urban Design sees students realize a neighborhood level master plan in Gandhinagar by understanding the key elements of urban design while also exploring ways to prepare drawings that communicate better. Masters in Infrastructure program involves students conceptualize an infrastructural plan, its preliminary cost estimates and prepare pilot demonstration proposals while working on the principles of sustainability, inclusiveness and resilience. Students pursuing Masters in Urban Housing are looking forward to unlock housing markets of Vadodara through policies, programs and regulations.

#### **FP Lecture Series**

FP Lecture Series kicked off this semester with sessions by Massimo Bricocoli and Neeraj Tyagi, enlightening students of their experiences.

Massimo Bricocoli, MSc in Architecture and PhD in Urban and regional Planning is currently teaching at the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies of Politecnico di Milano and is a visiting faculty at various eminent colleges and universities. He talked about Urban Regeneration in European Cities and social change in postindustrial times. He feels that the design of Urban Policies and Projects needs more focus on people and quality of places.











Neeraj Tyagi is the Vice-President of GIFT City, Ahmedabad which is India's first operational smart city. He enlightened students on 29 January, 2019 about Smart Cities where he talked about why Gujarat was selected as the site. He explained the concept of 'City as a system' which was further narrowed down to five sub-topics, namely, Physical Sub-System, Functional Sub-system, Psycho-perspective Sub-system, Geomorphological Sub-system and Anthropic Sub-system while stressing on the importance of understanding economics.

#### Wipro Earthian

Wipro Earthian 2018 invited students to present work across three themes of sustainability: Waste, Water and Mobility. Two teams were guided by Dr. Mona lyer, the first team comprising students from second year MURP, Shivani Khadke and Anupama V S who presented their work on solid waste management in Vadodara, highlighting the sustainability issues related to transportation of waste to the landfill. The second team, Prabhanjan Prabhu, Meet Kakadiya and Shourya Dubey from third year, B.UD, worked on pressing concern of the quality of water, water distribution system and condition of water bodies in low-income neighbourhood living in the south-eastern periphery of Ahmedabad. Another team of two students, Pratiksha Surpuriya and Aparna Ramesh from second year MURP, guided by Dr. Rutul Joshi bagged prize consecutively for the second time. They studied conflicts and contestations for walking and cycling on the roads of Ahmedabad.

SK: How are you associated with the profession currently?

SG: Currently I am teaching at Faculty of Planning at CEPT University. I am also involved in consultancy and research related to water & sanitation, and urban environment.

SK: Could you briefly explain your work profile?



SG: At CEPT, I teach courses like Environmental and Social Impact Assessment, Urban Infrastructure Planning & Management, and Professional Practices for Planners. I am also involved in academic administration. Currently, I am heading institutional ranking and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR).

SK: How was the transition from academics to profession?

SG: The Master of Planning programme at CEPT transformed me as an individual, deeply inculcating knowledge, ethics and attitude. This eventually helped me throughout my professional journey so far, to excel as a researcher, as a consultant and as a teacher. Also, the transition from being a corporate consultant at Price Waterhouse Coopers (PWC) to a professor at CEPT, would have not been possible without this invaluable transformation.

SK: Please share some of your nonacademic experiences from your days at Faculty of Planning.

SG: In the campus, every day was a celebration. However, I think we lived the best non-academic experiences in north lawn, hostel and during studio trips.



SK: Lastly, I would like to request you to share a message for the students.

SG: I believe, that to be a good professional, a person must be a good human being with positive attitude. Tomorrow you will become urban development professionals and your work will impact the lives of many people. Cities are changing rapidly and so do the challenges. 


#### **Conversation Starter | Water for all?**
